Our ED is frequently found catching creek critters or backpacking with friends, but she also loves sneaking up on wildlife in her kayak!



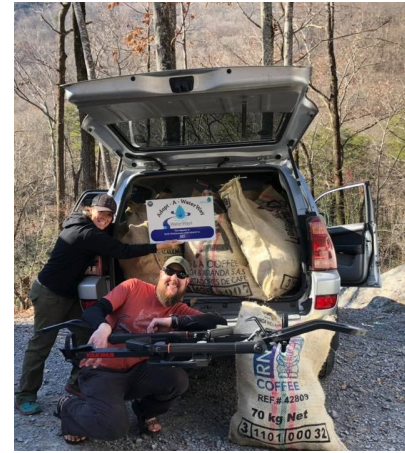

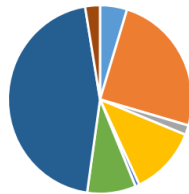

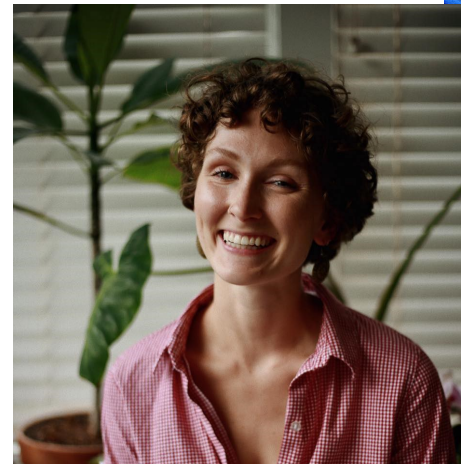
Our Amazing Team!
